

# PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF MITCHELL COUNTY, IOWA

Tuesday, June 8, 2021

The Board of Supervisors convened at 8:30 a.m. with all members present. Also present were Chuck Pajer, Casey Ketelsen, Tracy Church, Rich Brumm, Keith Horgen, Greg Beaver and Randy Conrad. Due to COVID 19 the meeting was made available by video via "Go to Meeting". Motion by Wherry, second by Mayer to approve the agenda. All voted aye.

Motion by Frein, second by Hendrickson to approve the minutes of the June 1<sup>st</sup> meeting and claims. Roll call vote: all voted aye.

County Attorney Walk had nothing to discuss.

County Sheriff Beaver mentioned there would be some overtime pay coming up with the different city celebrations. Beaver also stated there have been some speeding complaints in Stacyville. There is a contract the City of Stacyville signs with the County to help patrol, however the deputies must cover the rest of the county as well. Mayer stated he received a nuisance complaint in Mona, Beaver will check into this.

County Engineer Rich Brumm mentioned the contractor will be on site today at Hwy 9 and Foothill Avenue to do some handwork for that intersection. The intersection will be done this week and they will begin paving next Monday, starting at Hwy 9 and going north. Brumm stated they will be purchasing a 2005 Trail King trailer for about \$13,000 to transport the little excavator behind a dump truck, this transaction is in the budget. Austin Walk will be transitioning from Secondary Roads & Weed Commissioner to Conservation beginning July 1<sup>st</sup>. Brumm will work on filling that position the same way Austin did. Brumm stated there will be a bike ride going through Mitchell County. Mayer had a question regarding the opening of Primrose Avenue Bridge. Mayer also asked about the blading being done on the road south of Mitchell, half owned by the County and half owned by Mitchell. Smolik had a call from Keith Williams, wondering about re-opening the abandoned road, formerly known as Bridal Avenue.

Motion by Mayer, second by Hendrickson to approve using the American Rescue Plan Act Fund to pay for the new County Maintenance Garage. Roll call vote: all voted aye.

Motion by Hendrickson, second by Wherry to approve the County Social Services 28E Agreement. Roll call vote: all voted aye.

Items of Note: Wherry reported on the Upper Cedar Watershed and Mayer reported on Conservation. Smolik, Hendrickson and Frein had nothing to report. Received a Manure Management Plan update from Mark Patterson. There were no public comments.
